Recovering your entire system – If you've used Time Machine to back up your computer, you can recover your system's contents if your system or startup disk becomes damaged.

To recover your entire system:

- Connect your Time Machine backup disk to your computer.
- If you're restoring your system because of a problem with your startup disk, make sure the disk has been repaired or replaced.
- Insert your Mac OS X Install disk, and double-click the Install Mac OS X icon.
- In the Installer, choose Utilities > Restore System from Backup.
- In the Restore Your System dialog, click Continue.
- Select your Time Machine backup volume.
- Select the Time Machine backup you want to restore.
- Follow the onscreen instructions.

Copying files to a flash drive on a Mac:

1. Insert the flash drive into the USB port.
2. A white USB drive icon will appear on the desktop:
3. Find the files or folders you want to copy to the



- flash drive. **Select the files or folders** you want to save to the flash drive by clicking on them. To select more than one, hold down the APPLE key while you click and select all of the **files** and **folders** you wish to save.
4. Drag and drop the selected **files/folders** to the white USB flash drive icon.
 5. When you have finished copying, **do not immediately remove the flash drive from the USB port.** Instead, drag the white USB drive icon to the **Trash Can**, located on the **Dock**. Note: the **Trash Can** will change to the **Eject Icon**.
 6. The white USB drive icon will no longer be visible on your desktop. It is now safe to remove the flash drive from the USB port.

Copying files from a flash drive on a Mac:

1. Insert the flash drive into the USB port.
2. A white USB drive icon will appear on the desktop:
3. **Double-click** on the white USB drive icon to see the files and folders currently stored on the drive.
4. Open the folder where you would like to copy the files or folders from the Flash Drive.
5. Back at the USB flash drive folder, **select the files or folders** you want to copy from the flash drive by clicking on them. To select more than one, hold down the APPLE key while you click and select all of the files and folders you wish to save.
6. Drag and drop the selected **files/folders** to the folder on the computer where you would like them to be copied.
7. When you have finished copying, **do not immediately remove the flash drive from the USB port.** Instead, drag the white USB drive icon to the **Trash Can**, located on the **Dock**. Note: the **Trash Can** will change to the **Eject Icon**.
 - a. The white USB drive icon will no longer be visible on your desktop. It is now safe to remove the flash drive from the USB port.



If you wish the Flash Drive to work on both PC and Mac's DO NOT REFORMAT unless you know how to keep it as a MS-DOS drive.
