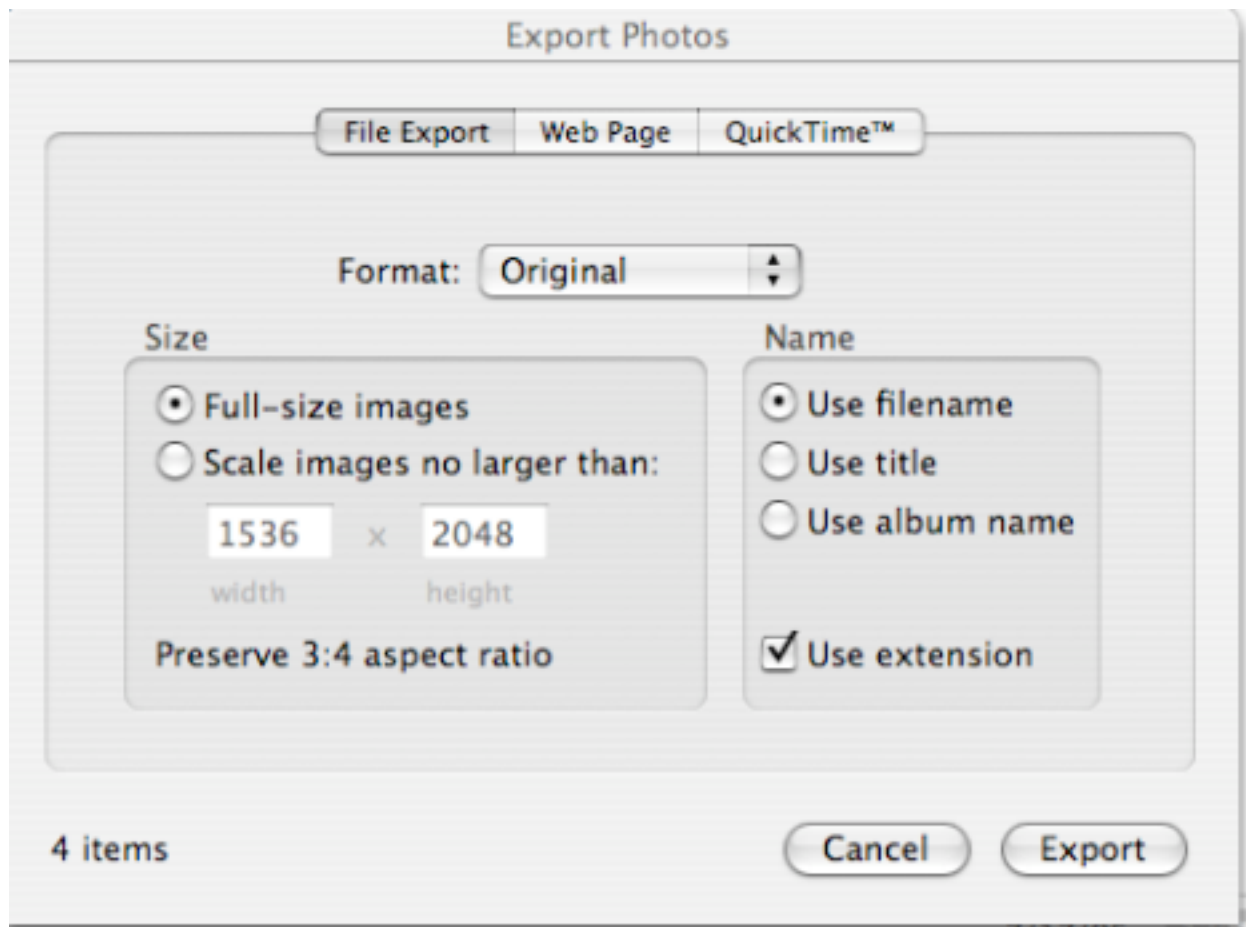


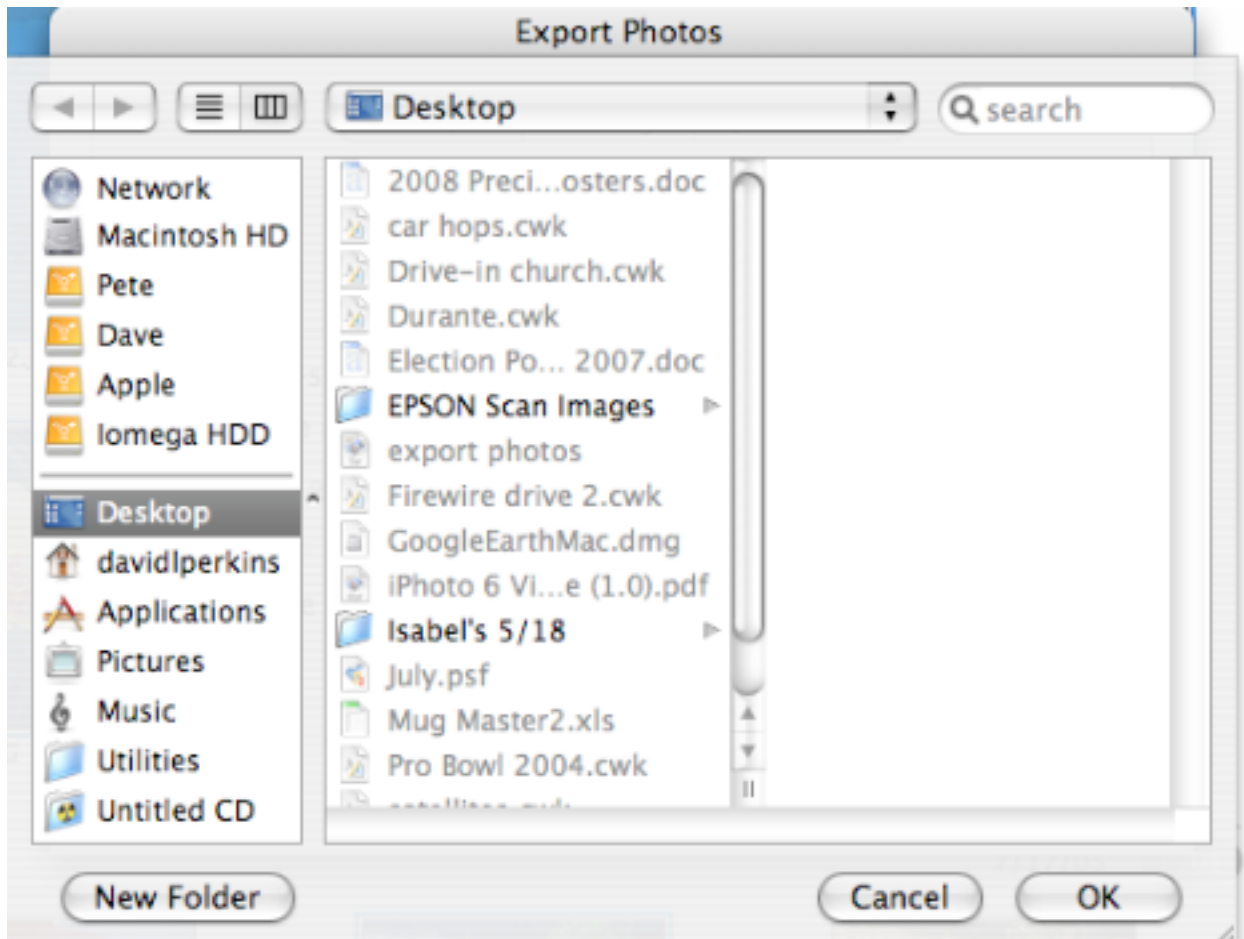
Copying Pictures to a CD or DVD Using Apple's Burn Program

Use either a CD-R or DVD-R. A CD holds about 250 to 300 pictures. A DVD holds about seven times that or approximately 2,000 pictures. If you use iPhoto as your primary storage and cataloging program, this procedure should be used if you are taking a CD or DVD to Costco, Longs or other photo places for having pictures printed - or for sharing with friends.

1. Open iPhoto and select the pictures you wish to copy (Cmd, click)
2. In the iPhoto Menu Bar
 - a. **single click** on "File"
 - b. scroll down to and **single click** on "Export"
3. A box titled "Export Photos" opens

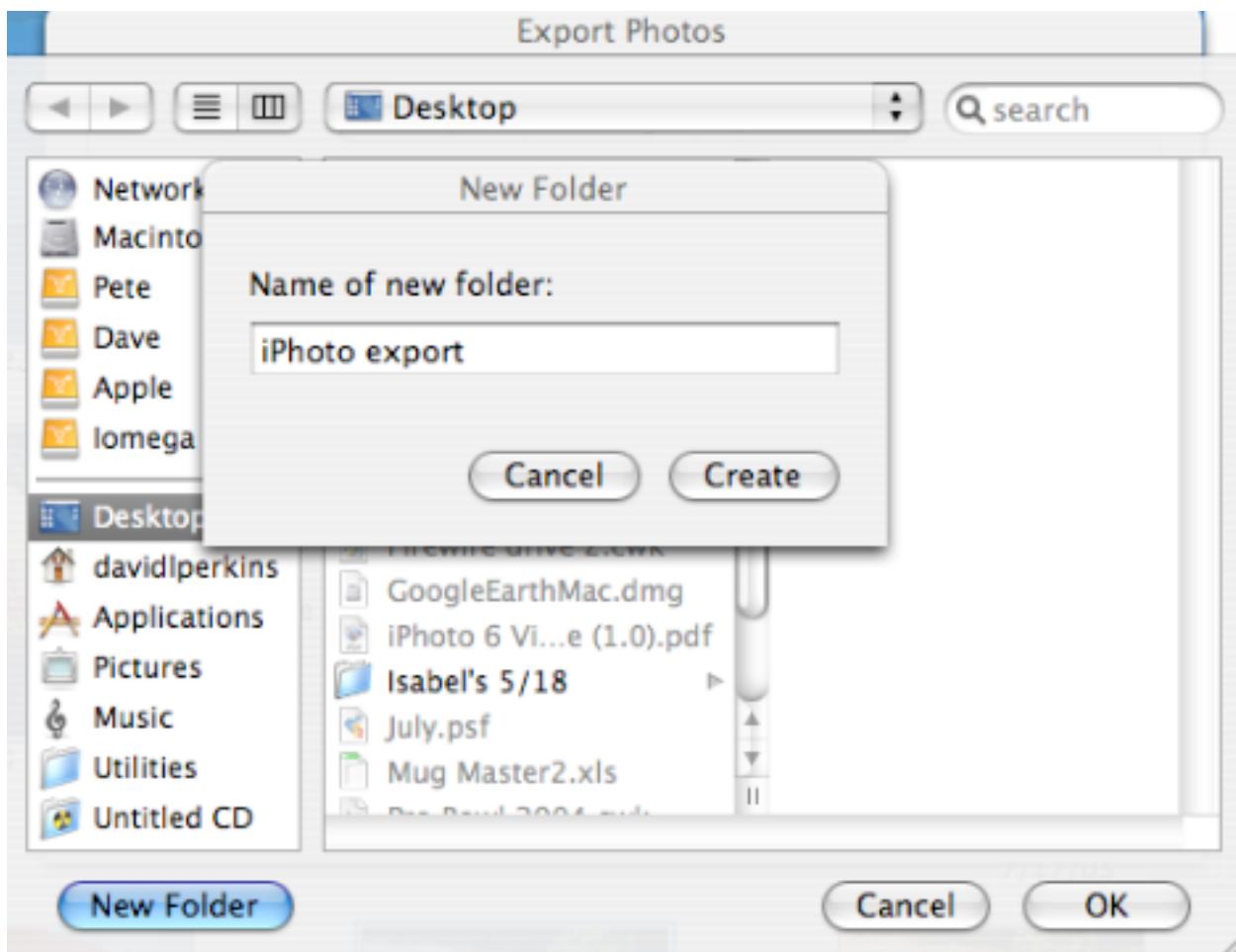


4. Single click “Export” in lower right corner
5. Another box appears on top of the Export Photos box



6. Make certain the line directly under “Export Photos” says “Desktop”
If it does not, change it
 - a. At the lower left hand corner single click on **New Folder**

b. In the box which appears, name the new folder (i.e., iPhoto export)



c. **Single click** "Create." The new folder will appear on the desktop

d. In the box titled "Export Photos" **single click** **OK** in the lower right corner to export the photos

7. Quit iPhoto

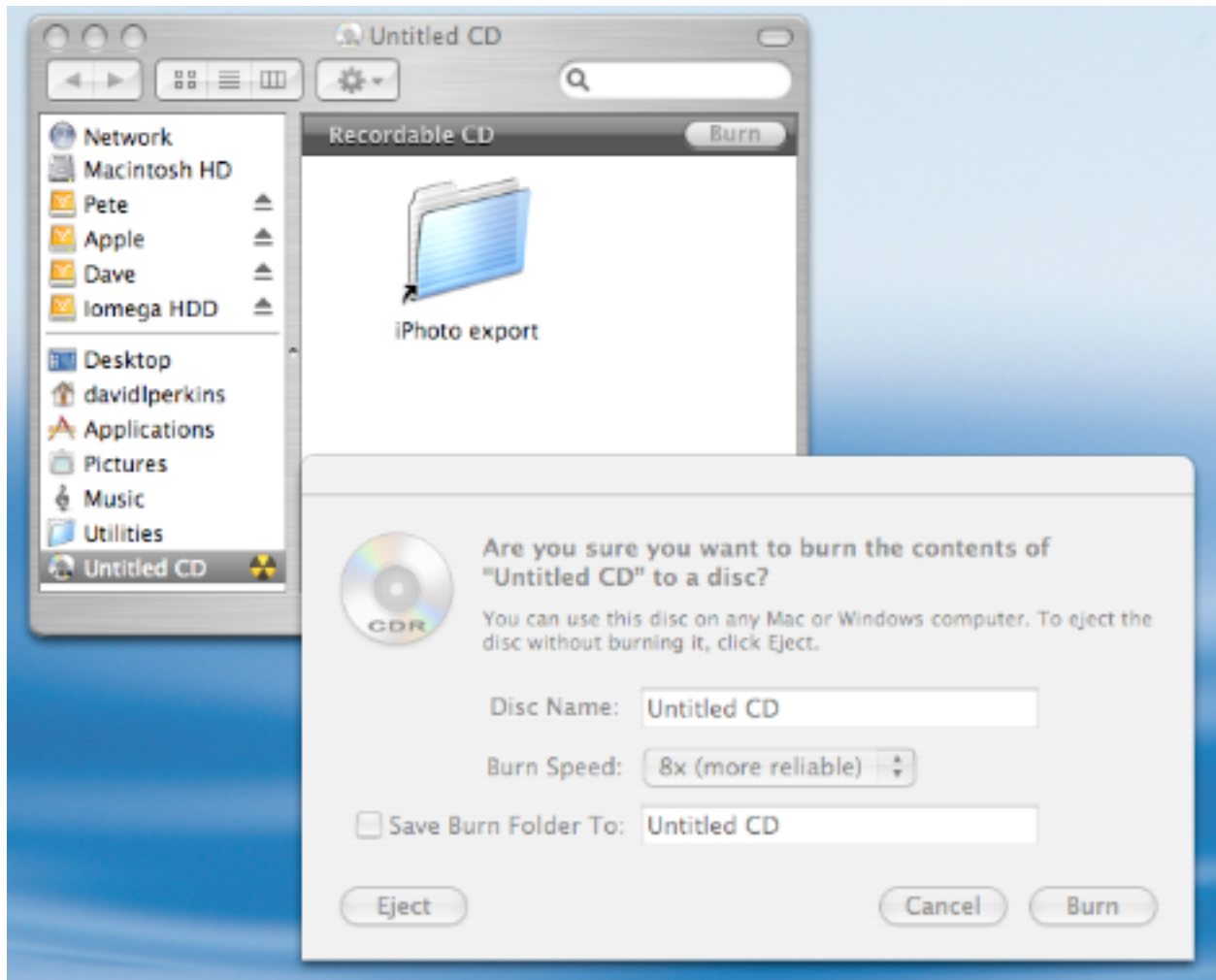
8. Insert a blank CD-R or DVD-R disk
A box appears asking what you want to do. Click on OK

9. Drag the folder of exported photos to the disk icon.

10. **Double click** on the disc icon and a window called Untitled CD opens.

The folder with the pictures should be in this window with the title you gave it

11. In the upper RH corner of this window **single click** on burn



12. A new window opens asking you to choose a title for the disc and choose a burn speed

13. After you name the disc, click on burn

14. When the burn is complete, eject and label the disc.
(Note: Use only special markers made for this purpose).
